On August 24, 1814, British troops burned the Capitol building (where the Library was housed) and destroyed the Library's core collection of 3,000 volumes. The Children's Poetry Club

The Smithville Public Library initiated the Children's Poetry Club in late June. Dr. James Kraft, who teaches philosophy and religion at Huston-Tillotson University in Austin, spearheads this activity. The purpose of the club is to introduce poetry to children ranging in age from 6 to 12. Children have the opportunity to create, illustrate, and read their own poems and to read the work of published poets. The Club meets every Thursday from 2 to 3 p.m. during the summer.

Dr. Kraft has chosen poetry as the focus of this club because he wishes to introduce children to the nuances of language. Understanding the nuances of language, he believes, is critical to future educational endeavors. In addition, he wants children to realize that playing with words to create poetry can be as much fun as playing a physical sport.
